The Lead Like Jesus workshop was a beautifully interactive experience, filled with warmth and genuine participation from everyone involved. It was deeply moving to witness the collective engagement in every activity. The workshop powerfully reinforced the importance of having a pure heart to foster righteous thoughts. This profound message echoes the wisdom of *Proverbs 4:23 – "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."* The facilitators, Eileen and Jover, emphasized that a pure and righteous heart shapes our thoughts, decisions, and actions, aligning our motivations and intentions with God's will and guiding us to act justly in all aspects of our lives.

The workshop was touching, as I saw people reconcile, offer and ask for forgiveness, and share prayers and gratitude with one another. The sense of unity that emerged among the community members, despite the numerous challenges we faced, was heartwarming. The experience brought everyone healing, connection, and a renewed sense of purpose. This experience left a lasting impact on me, and I hope it did the same for everyone present. "Lead like Jesus" emphasizes servant leadership with a genuine desire to serve others rather than seeking power or authority. Key qualities to lead like Jesus are integrity and character; virtues include humility, listening, willingness to serve, and a compassionate and forgiving heart; abilities spotlight the power to influence, foresee a vision, and empower members.

A truly symbolic moment during this workshop was when we "washed" the feet of other members with a "white towel" (no water), demonstrating that no task is too humble for a leader. Many shed tears, asking for forgiveness and/or appreciating each other for the work they do in the community. The Meaning of the Holy Eucharist by Suzeth Sanares, Youth Ministry Coordinator

Has your child ever asked you "Mom, why do we go to mass on Sundays?" or your teenage son said, "God is everywhere, I can talk to Him anytime".

Do we know someone who started to lose motivation in going to mass because the choir is boring, the priest doesn't give a nice homily, the parishioners are not welcoming, or have we at times experienced our minds wandering around during mass?"

To gain a better understanding of the significance & importance of going to Mass, the Youth Ministry (as part of their Lenten activities) was very grateful to our very own Spiritual Director, Fr. Nixon D'Silva who gave us a talk about the Holy Eucharist last March 22, 2024.

Fr. Nixon gave a much simpler formula of for the order of the mass by highlighting the four actions for each part of the mass. First part – Introductory rite (Come), second part -Liturgy of the Word (Listen), third part -Liturgy of the Eucharist (Do) & the last part – Concluding rite (Go).



Furthermore, he gave a clear explanation of the purpose of the Eucharist as follows: Eucharist is about BELONGING – we belong to a church that helps to form the connection & helps us to understand that we belong to the Body of Christ.

Eucharist is about CELEBRATION – it is actively participating in singing, responding, kneeling/standing/sitting. For the Eucharist to become a celebration, we need to ACTIVELY participate. We enjoy the celebration when there is participation. It is also important to ask ourselves if we too are actively participating.

Eucharist is about LISTENING – we listen, understand & respond. When we listen attentively throughout the Mass, we will understand & when we understand, we respond. When we listen to the Word of God & all the prayers carefully, when we listen to the different aspects of the Mass, the word & message will truly come into our hearts.

Eucharist is about CARING – this is loving others as Jesus loves us & caring for others as Jesus cares for us. This is being sensitive to the needs of others, to offer support in many ways.

Eucharist is about PEACE – "Go in peace and serve the Lord". Jesus is the Prince of Peace. We come to the Eucharist to experience the peace. Do not allow Satan to destroy that peace within us. We find inner peace in the Blessed Sacrament. Let our eyes be fixated on the Eucharist.

The Meaning of the Holy Eucharist by Suzeth Sanares, Youth Ministry Coordinator

Eucharist is about GIVING THANKS – we come to church to give thanks – for the sacrifice on the cross. The crucifix in all the churches is a reminder for us to give thanks to Jesus for dying on the cross. He offered himself as a sacrifice to bring us salvation & give us His Spirit. The mass is Jesus' sacrifice made present again.

We also come to church to give thanks to the sacrament at the altar – when the priest offers his prayers over the gifts, the bread & wine, this very particular part of the Mass, time COLLAPSES. This is the time that we go back to the Last Supper when Jesus Himself was the main Celebrant. Father Nixon emphasized that when he says, "This is my body" and "This is my blood", it is NOT already him saying those words, but JESUS is present in the person of him.

Eucharist is about NEW LIFE – it is a thanksgiving celebration of the new life we have in Christ Jesus.

Eucharist is about SHARING A MEAL – it is the Lord's Supper. Jesus is giving us His very self & will be with us always in this meal. He makes His body & blood present to us in a real way. We receive Him into ourselves. Tangibly, He becomes our food. And in sharing that meal, we will be energized to go to others and proclaim the new life that He promised.

What struck me the most during Fr. Nixon's talk was when he showed us a short video of what is exactly happening during the Mass. This gave me goosebumps & I highly recommend you check out the video for yourself (link below). <u>This is what really happens at the Eucharist Catholic Mass (youtube.com</u>)

In this modern world, we might know someone who no longer sees the need or find excuses to not go to Mass. Or maybe others who say that they just don't get much out of it or sadly no longer believe that God exists.

If we want to see these people come back to the table of the Lord, personal witness is powerful. Let us do our part to evangelize, let us pray & strive to show them how the Eucharist offers a unique opportunity to encounter God that is not available anywhere else.

When we go to mass, we are connected to the life-giving power of Jesus. This is also a time to be challenged, through the Word & Sacrament & a time to give thanks for our many blessings. The celebration of Mass serves to connect us to the truth of the living God who is the center of our lives.

Fr. Nixon ended his talk by asking "Are you ready to share Jesus with others?"

Ben Carlos' Mission Trip with CCO to Honduras

Last May, 2024, I went on a mission trip to Honduras with Catholic Christian Outreach (CCO), a missionary organization dedicated to Catholic evangelism on university campuses across Canada. Every year, CCO organizes mission trips to foreign countries with the hope of spreading the gospel. They explain the gospel to people and invite them into a personal relationship with Jesus through prayer to spark a personal conversion in them. They also accompany these people, guiding them in their spiritual journey.





Together with other 18 student missionaries and four professional missionaries from across Canada, I had this chance to evangelize university students and the opportunity to share the gospel with orphans and the locals. We also worked with a Honduran missionary group and the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal (CFR). I hoped to share the joy and freedom of living with Christ with others. I wanted to do God's will and; *make disciples of all nations';* (Matthew 28:19-20) so that people might have life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:11)

My mission team's first assignment was on May 18. I went into this mission expecting that sharing the gospel with people would be that easy. But as soon as I arrived at the retreat, I was met with stares and silence. I found it hard to connect with them. The culture and language barrier was intimidating and I was afraid to talk to people; moreover, people seemed afraid to talk to me. I didn't know what to do then! But not all hope was lost. I prayed and was reminded that without relying on the grace of God and cooperating with my missionary teammates, I could do nothing. And so I prayed for the opportunity to connect with the students to share the gospel. Later that night, my prayers were heard. After the eucharistic adoration, I prayed over some students with one of my missionary teammates. We took care of the English-speaking line. During the prayer-overs, the people we met cried, rejoiced, and felt at peace because of the love of Jesus that was showed to them at that moment. They shared whatever was on their hearts and we would pray for their intentions. It was a beautiful image, seeing the love of God working through me as people turned their hearts to Jesus.

Later that night, I sang praise and worship songs with them and danced in their drum circle. Though I did not speak the same language or come from the same culture, the love of God in the Spirit of Christ connected us. Everyone felt this great joy and freedom in living as beloved children of God through Jesus. I was overjoyed to see the fullness of life in Christ that I hoped to share with others on my mission trip. As the mission went on, God grew my confidence in Him little by little, every day, and increased my capacity to love and serve others. One example of this happened halfway through the mission trip on May 26th. We held a one-day retreat for the local orphans. After celebrating morning mass with them, they came to the retreat center where we were stationed. We prepared food, played games, and sang songs for and with them. I also had the blessing of sharing my testimony that day.

A Spanish-speaking missionary translated my testimony as I spoke it. I shared with them how seeing people going to confession as a facilitator for BLD Youth Encounter #22 moved my heart and led me into a deeper relationship with God. And so, I invited them all to go to confession and have a personal relationship with Jesus through prayer. Throughout the day, I interacted with them, taught them dance moves, and served them food. We really had a fun time together.

After the eucharistic adoration, the CFR priests held confession. A few orphans, after years of not going to confession, received the sacrament. Two girls who were into arguments that day, went to confession, made up, and hugged afterward, saying "It feels like we're in heaven!". Three boys who were resistant at first struggled to get through the sacrament but went to receive it at the end. The orphans commented that I made confession sound so amazing — like it was a beautiful thing that didn't have to be so scary. They said that they saw the light of Christ in me. The freedom and joy I had within me inspired them to live life with Jesus again. Hearing this filled my heart and I thank God for calling me to Honduras to share His love with others.

Nearing the end of the mission on June 2nd, we helped organize a eucharistic procession in downtown Comayagua. We had just wrapped up another retreat for university students the night before. We invited them to the retreat after leading them in faith studies for about a week on campus. One student from the retreat decided to stay with us for the procession. As we arrived downtown, I was paired up with this student to start spiritual conversations with locals and invited them to the procession. Sharing the gospel with this person made me realize the abundance of love and attention that God gives a single soul to let them know that they are loved by Him. Some missionaries had led this student in a faith study, some gave him spiritual guidance at the retreat, and others prayed over him there. He received a lot of love from our missionary team which helped him say yes to accepting Jesus in his life.

During the retreat, I remember being in a discussion group with him and he expressed his issues in his relationship with Jesus. Just before the procession began, I asked him if he still felt the same, and if he did, then we could pray about it. He opened up a little more about his situation and we lifted his worries to Jesus. Little by little, effort by effort, God had used our missionary team to draw this person's heart closer to His. More than before, he felt the love of Jesus. He felt at peace in surrendering his life to Him. About a week after our mission ended, he messaged me over Instagram to express how he was grateful that we met and that he is happier now because he feels closer to God. Knowing this made me realize how awesome the plan of God is. I was reminded that God's love for us is deeply personal and that evangelization truly happens one person at a time. At its core, evangelization is inviting people, young or old, near or far, into the body of Christ. It is an act of love which unites us. As Christians, we are called to love and to evangelize.

Overall, my mission trip to Honduras was amazing. I am so grateful for the BLD Community and to the IC Delta parishioners for their support in my mission. Thank you for all the prayers, donations, and advice. Thank you too for playing a huge role in my spiritual upbringing. Without these, I would not have been able to share Jesus with others and because of you, people in Honduras have encountered Jesus. Thank you! God Bless!

Families develop practical strategies for effective communication and conflict resolution, fostering a harmonious home environment and a collective commitment to their faith.

A Transformative Journey. Attending the Solo Person Encounter (SPE) by Peachie Luzung, SPE# Class No 9

From May 31st (Friday) to June 2nd (Sunday), 2024, I had the privilege of attending the Single Parent Encounter organized by Bukas Loob sa Diyos (BLD) Vancouver District. This event was more than just a retreat; it was a life-changing experience that brought together solo parents and single persons from various backgrounds, united by their faith and the challenges they face. The weekend was filled with inspiring talks, heartfelt sharing, and moments of deep reflection and prayer. I will share the highlights of this transformative journey and how it has impacted me personally.

Attending the Single Parent Encounter by BLD was a transformative experience. The weekend was filled with deep connection, personal growth, and spiritual renewal. 
The Sound of Silence by Simon & Garfunkel

The Sound of Silence

A Christian Interpretation by Felian D. Cabael, SPE#9

Stanza 1: The very first line captures our initial feelings that we are familiar with Hello darkness my old friend: trials, tribulations, and staying in a comfort zone of numbness and nothingness and hiding in the shadows out of sight. *Left its seed while I was sleeping*, metaphors of seeds in the bible to plant ideas to be rooted within our minds from sources consciously and subconsciously as in a dream waiting for a moment of attention and awareness when eliminating negative distractions enlightens that hope of a Vision from the Holy Spirit.

Stanza 2: The Halo reference gives a visual image of angelic and holy illumination even from a man-made street lamp, the idea of searching for something greater. As we persist, lost in our struggle alone quietly, we turn our collar to the cold and damp - to tolerate what can sometimes be unbearable. *Eyes stabbed by the flash of a neon light, split the night*. This line conjures up an image of God's lightning bolt against a dark sky to awaken us, shocking us to snap out of it and take action. Also from the first lines of the bible in the book of Creation "The heavens and the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep." ...Then God said Let there be light. And there was light.

Stanze 3: In the naked light, I saw 10,000 people maybe more. Pure natural light reveals a number and reference in the bible mentioned twice, once in the book of Daniel 7 and then in Revelations 5 "Ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him". People talking without speaking, as how we all currently communicate digitally through texting, emailing, etc. organic expressions and emotions are missing. Hearing without listening, auditory senses are intact yet our comprehension, compassion, and lack of connection to understand one another are sometimes lacking. Writing songs that voices never share, a reference to the Book of Songs of Solomon describes both marriage and God's relationship to his people about commitment and intimacy.

Stanza 4: "Fools," said I, "You do not know silence like a cancer grows. I think of Jesus' words on the cross "Forgive them Father for they do not know". Being in the health profession, we prevent cancer, or sickness from taking root by prevention, good lifestyle, education, and good choices. In an unhealthy state of neglect and inaction, we lose the essence of being alive and well as humans but more like artificial intelligence (AI), and robotic empathy. Hear my words that I might teach you. Jesus speaks to us through scripture, readings, sermons, and in the kindness of others. Take my arms that I might reach you - be receptive and humble enough to be on the receiving end of that helping outstretched hand keeping us from drowning in sorrow and feeling the connection through touch, the energy of the Holy Spirit working from one another in true friendship and genuine love of neighbor. But my words like silent raindrops fell - visually illustrate to me of God's tears falling from heaven when we forget to keep HIm as the center of our universe, focusing our mind and our soul staying connected with Him otherwise all the teachings fall into an empty well, an abyss and state of decay.

Stanza 5: And the people bowed and prayed to the neon god they made -worshipping false gods, power and status, and anything that becomes an unhealthy obsession. And the sign flashed out its warning, we must heed. The words of the prophets are written everywhere and anywhere we go. In the tunnels of the subway or Skytrain stations as we rush through the busyness of our day oblivious to the beauty around us and tenement halls are a metaphor for this earth, the world we live in representing shared dwelling places.
